## A word from our pastor Rev. Dane Womack



Happy August, Paragould FUMC!
Greetings in the name of our Lord &
Savior Jesus Christ! I write to you after a
very exciting few weeks at First United
Methodist Church. Summer can
sometimes be a downtime in church.
Many people are traveling. Giving and
attendance can wane. Participation in
ministries may be slowed. But that has
not been the case this year. I write this
month to share with you celebrations,
updates, and some questions about our
immediate future.

First, we hosted and celebrated Ready, Set, Read! at FUMC June 28-July 2. You are likely more familiar with RSR than I was. Children from around our community came each day for meals, games, fellowship, and exercises in improving literacy skills. We had wonderful volunteers from FUMC and our community. Please share a word of appreciation and encouragement with Danielle Honeycutt and Angela Newby for their work leading this awesome ministry. The Arkansas Conference has adopted a missional emphasis on children's literacy across the state and our program is a flagship example of such efforts.

Second, we hosted Ozark Mission Project day camp July 5-9. Youth and adult volunteers from FUMC, Cornerstone UMC, and Rector FUMC shared in meals and worship at FUMC in mornings and evenings while their days were spent on job sites in Paragould, Jonesboro, Monette, and Walnut Ridge. We built 4 wheelchair ramps, repaired decks and stairs, and cleaned up multiple yards. It was an inspiring week of hard work and shared ministry. OMP holds a special place in my heart and it was such a joy to share in this ministry at FUMC.

Lastly, we just wrapped up a wonderful week of Vacation Bible School July 12-15. Adventure Island! Seeking God's Light! Andrea Pearson led a small army of adult volunteers who cared for children while sharing in games, crafts, music, meals, and Bible stories. It was a high energy week!




#### 2 positions available

Director of Student Ministries, and Director of Children's Ministries

We have two staff openings at FUMC. The first is a full-time position titled Director of Student Ministries with oversight for grades 5th - 12th. The second is a part-time position titled Director of Children's Ministries with responsibilities for ages PreK - 4th grade. A change is grouping 5th-6th graders under the full-time job. This change also makes the children's position more part-time. Expectations for the Children's Director will primarily include Sunday mornings, Wednesday evenings, and special events. We imagine this position could be appealing to someone with another job, perhaps someone already in our congregation. Please be in prayer regarding these positions.

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Our church's children were so happy to be together and sharing this time. We also welcomed many guests and friends. And a number of kids joined us in leading VBS songs at the 9am service on Sunday, July 18.

You will see photos and reflections on each of these ministries in the following pages. Though it was a long three weeks, it was a great inspiration! Sharing in ministries of service, outreach, care, and discipleship are central to our church's call. What a thrill to see Paragould FUMC in action in such fun ways. Our church is alive! Thank you to everyone who supported these ministries. I am already looking forward to next summer, though we might not schedule all three back-to-back next time!

Our financial reporting has been delayed while Denise was tending to Larry's healthcare in Houston. We are so glad to have the Chipmans back in Paragould and continue to pray for Larry. Both our Finance Committee and Trustees met in July for the first time in a while. Below are a few notes.

First, I invite you to consider a snapshot of our current financial standing including summaries for May, June, and Year-to-date. The short of it is this: we are very pleased with our financial situation and are optimistic about its continued strength. You can see that giving has been strong and is year-to-date ahead of spending. We are keeping up well with both monthly budgetary expenses and our building loan. With respect to our loan, we continue to make monthly interest payments and were able to make a significant payment toward principal this summer that was not due until December. We made this payment now because anytime we can reduce our principal we more quickly reduce our interest and total loan cost. We have also received a number of memorials and designated gifts that are reflected in the YTD Total Received value of \$682,227.

Which leads to an update on our facilities. You may have noticed this summer that crews have begun working on the exterior of our facilities. I'll remind you this is "Phase 1" of three with the intention of waterproofing and repairing water damage to the exterior Sanctuary. (More and different work will be needed to address the water damage inside in the future.) In Phase 1, the brick is being cleaned and water-proof-treated, all windows and fixtures are being caulked, and mortar is being repaired. I invite you to take a look at how much better the Sanctuary already looks! So happy this work has begun and look forward to continuing to repair and care for our worship spaces.

I hope you see the connection between the first few paragraphs of this note and the last two paragraphs. Thrilling, inspiring, and vital ministry is happening at FUMC for the sake of children, youth, adults and our community. Just as it should be! And these ministries are made possible because of our shared resources including financial strength and wonderful facilities. The tithes and gifts you offer to FUMC are in direct support of ministry. Our addition and renovated facilities as well as maintenance on our older buildings are for the sake of ministry - so that we might "Love God, Serve People, and Make a Difference." Thank you for your steadfast support including financial gifts, time, and energy.

Lastly, for some concerns. As I write this newsletter in mid-July, local and national news headlines exclaim that Arkansas has become the center of the highest rates of spread of COVID-19. This "delta variant" is causing more cases and greater sickness with those infected. I am so disheartened by this news. On a personal note, this makes me very sad. The months of navigating COVID were difficult and lonely. I was hoping that season was permanently behind us. Yet, here we are again. As of this writing, I am not sure what these new circumstances will mean for our church. Our Trustees will take up the matter and make decisions in support of our church's and our community's safety. This means some of our August plans are currently in jeopardy. Our calendar is disrupted - again. But take heart! We can do this! We will be safe while continuing our ministry as best we can. I have every confidence in our congregation and I encourage you to take care. Pay attention to the recommendations of the CDC, AR Dept of Health, and your local physicians. More updates to come.

It is a joy to serve alongside the people of Paragould First United Methodist Church. We have much to celebrate and look forward to for months and years to come. COVID is a challenge but it is not a determinative factor. Ministry has and will flourish. To God be the glory.





## Ready, Set, READ!

One of the best environments for the development of strong literacy skills for kids usually happens at school, but when class ends for the year and children go home for the summer, those reading skills tend to fall off and can sometimes stop developing altogether.

For nearly a decade, FUMC has aimed to break that summer reading slump with its Ready, Set, Read summer program, a weeklong event that encourages kids in the area to continue reading and learning during the summer months.

"Ready, Set, Read came out of a Wednesday night Bible study in which Angela (Newby) and I were both participating," said Danielle Honeycutt, one of the program coordinators for Ready, Set, Read. "The study was over the book, 'Outlive Your Life' by Max Lucado. During the discussion, Angela and I started talking about the low literacy rate of our students and we wondered how we could break the cycle."

The idea that spawned from that meeting was Ready, Set, Read. Newby, who is also a program coordinator for the event, and Honeycutt said the mission of the event is getting kids to read during the summer, with the hope of avoiding the regression that happens when they're out of school for several months.

Some of this year's guest readers included Paragould School District and Greene County Tech School District principals and superintendents; Paragould police officers, firefighters, and paramedics; and representatives from the Paragould Chamber of Commerce, Junior Auxiliary, and Nunn Construction. Paragould Mayor Josh Agee also participated in a video where he read the "Book With No Pictures" to his two young daughters.

Honeycutt and Newby said they hope that kids who participate in Ready, Set, Read leave the event with a love of learning and reading.

"We sent them home with brand new books to start their own libraries at home. We want them to read while they aren't at school and we want their siblings to read also. If we can get books into the hands of children and teach them about Jesus and serving and loving our neighbors, we have done our jobs," Newby said.

"We are looking forward to expanding our efforts in not only fighting childhood hunger, focusing on literacy, and promoting healthy, stable families as a means of hope and assistance for families to move out of poverty; we are looking forward to making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world, through loving God, serving others, and making a difference," Chase Burns, associate pastor, said.












## **Ozark Mission Project**
