PARAGOULD FUMC Youth & Adult Campers (Drivers) - this will be a typical OMP camp despite us hosting at FUMC. You will be attending just like the campers from other churches. You will stay at camp including sleeping at church and participating in shower houses. You cannot come/go with the flexibility of 2021 day camp.

Youth Camper Covenant

Youth Camper Roles and Responsibilities: Attend OMP Orientation; Completed the 6th grade; Follow the OMP dress code; Know that OMP does not condone or tolerate sexual harassment or abuse in any form.; Remain drug, alcohol, and tobacco free during OMP.; Weapons or fireworks are prohibited.; Eat lunch at the work site.; Participate in all OMP activities.

Youth Camper Expectations: Behave in a caring, Christian manner.; Display servant leadership in word and action.; Have a love for God.; Work with staff to provide service to our neighbors with dignity, compassion, love and understanding.; Be respectful of others.; Pray for the safety and wellbeing of our neighbors, staff, and campers.; Offer positive, supportive interaction with staff and campers.

Adult Camper (Driver) Covenant

Adult Roles and Responsibilities: Attend OMP Orientation; Bring the proper OMP vehicle to camp: must have 5 seat belts and space for tools, supplies, and an ice chest.; Submit proof of legal driver's license, registration, and vehicle insurance for the vehicle at OMP to the Youth Director.; Have a first aid kit in your vehicle and release forms for each person in your Family Group.; Any time you leave the jobsite, take *everyone* in your Family Group with you. No exceptions.; Know that

OMP does not condone or tolerate sexual harassment or abuse in any form.; Remain drug and alcohol free and acknowledge that tobacco use is discouraged at OMP.; Follow the OMP dress code.; Drive safely and follow driving laws.; Understand there will be no romantic relationships with campers or staff.; Eat lunch at the worksite. Breaking bread with one another is an important step in building a relationship while reading and talking about the devotion.

Adult Expectations: Work with the Leadership Team to provide service to our neighbors with dignity, compassion, love, and understanding.; Participate in all activities.; Let the youth be the leadership for your Family Group – do not assume the leadership role, be a participant.; Talk to the Youth Director if you have a conflict in your Family Group.; Be responsible for the safety of your Family Group.

DRESS CODE: Long pants must always be worn. Shirts with at least short sleeves (no spaghetti straps or tank tops) must always be worn. Sturdy shoes (no sandals) must always be worn. Clothing with inappropriate graphics or advertising is not permitted, including political advertising.

NEIGHBORS/JOB: We need more neighbors/jobs in this area. Blank applications have been shared with many churches/NPOs. But word of mouth may be best. Please spread the word. Copies of blank applications are at church or can be found at <https://ozarkmissionproject.org/community>

SHOWER HOUSES: 15 shower houses. 12 for family groups. 1 for staff. 2 backup. 3 are confirmed. Need 12 more. Usually takes about 1 to 1 1/2 hours to shower everyone beginning at 4pm. At least 2 bathrooms is helpful. Must be an adult/host at home when the family group is there. Drugs, guns, knives, throwing stars, missile launchers, etc. need to be locked up. Hosts may provide sweets/drinks, but not a meal because campers will be eating at church after showering. Hosts will provide toiletries (soap, shampoo), washcloths, towels, etc. There are 2 showers at FUMC that can be used if needed by staff/volunteers on limited basis.

MEALS/FOOD: FUMC will provide 2 hot meals per day for approximately 100 people (breakfast & dinner).
