

## A Word from Our Pastor

## Happy Advent and Merry Christmas from Paragould First United Methodist Church! <br> Paragould FUMC is providing a devotional titled Advent: Let Every Heart Prepare Him Room to members and worshippers as we prepare to celebrate Christmas. Author Kerry van der Vinne says, "For many of us, the month of December is characterized by frantic activity and heightened emotion as we anticipate Christmas with shopping, decorating, cooking, and a flurry of seasonal obligations. In the frenzy to get ready for the outward rituals of Christmas we can fail to prepare our hearts. Advent is an invitation to step away from the tumult. Advent doesn't fit neatly into a soundbite or vignette. It's too complex, too deep, to compete with glifter and noise. But Advent is too important to be forgotten, because it is the season that prepares us to encounter our Lord."

 Your pastors chose this devotional booklet because we believe it can be a helpful resource in guiding our prayers and spiritual disciplines in preparation for Advent. The author captures well the ancient practices that still shape our faith today.

You may sense a bit of a theme in my preaching and leadership lately. As fast as the world rushes on, I count it a blessing and gift to learn from the Saints and the traditions of church that keep us grounded and growing in faith. So it is with Advent. In this season we remember what it means to wait for the Lord. Our anticipation of Christmas mirrors our anticipation of Christ's return and final victory. Advent teaches us to wait with hope-filled patience and expectation, knowing God is at work within us and around in remarkable ways.

I want to encourage you to lean into your life of faith this Advent. Pray along with the rest of the church using the provided devotional. Give attention to important ministries of worship, fellowship, and service. Focus your spirit not on countless tasks, but on the surprising work of God across history and in our lives today. Advent is here! Jesus is coming! Soon we will celebrate Christmas!

As you study this newsletter, you will find information on many opportunities ahead the next few weeks. I cannot capture all of the details here, but I want to draw your attention to a few key events. FUMC will once again
 share in the Downtown Centennial Park Tree Lighting led by our choir (Dec. 1, 6pm). The Youth Christmas Progressive Dinner is always fun (Dec. 3, 5pm). Along with our usual Cookies \& Communion, FUMC will share Carols with our friends at the Chateau (Dec. 4, 10am). The Children's Program \& Kinders Concert brings fellowship and joy (Dec. 10, 5pm). The annual Choir Concert will be in the Sanctuary, including guest instrumentalists (Dec. 17, 6pm). And lastly - note that Christmas Eve falls on Sunday this year! Meaning the Fourth Sunday of Advent is Christmas Eve. Therefore, we have adjusted our worship schedule slightly by moving the

noon service to 11 am while the $5 \mathrm{pm}, 7 \mathrm{pm}$, and 11 pm services remain the same. All services will be in the Sanctuary, including communion and candlelight.

Please consider inviting others to worship and ministry opportunities this season. We will make use of social media and various advertising, but the most successful way to engage others is through personal invitation. Who will you invite to FUMC this Advent and Christmas? Can you offer to give them a ride? Can you plan to sit with them at church?

We have enjoyed a fun-filled fall at FUMC, including such ministries as Trunk-or-Treat. The rain put a damper on things, but we adjusted and had a wonderful time inside. We think we had $500+$ in our building that evening. FUMC hosted Charge Conference for other area churches on November 5. Thanks to the Praise Band and Hospitality Team for helping make others feel welcome. It was inspiring to hear encouraging reports from ours and other local churches. We enjoyed a wonderful fall session of Connect Wednesday thanks to our excellent volunteers, including the many who work in the kitchen. Our junior high youth just returned from an excellent "REFUGE" retreat in the Ozarks. FUMC has welcomed new guests and members in the last few months. Our worship attendance is up $10 \%$, and new people are joining regularly!

One ministry that is very important to our church is our annual Confirmation group. This year's students are meeting on Sunday evenings, alongside parents/guardians and mentors. To date, we have shared in six sessions. Our students are bright, interesting, and spiritually engaged. Please hold the following students in prayer: Izzy Branch, Hadley Ewing, Barrett Herget, Charli Hinkle, Barrett Lawrence, Evan Pearson, Dinah Sills, Maralyn Weaver, Benjamin Williams, Lawson Wooldridge, Korban Ellzey, Parker Watson, and Anna Horner.

The FUMC Witt House Food Pantry continues to see record numbers of clients sometimes serving 100 families per day. We are reminded of the many in our community who experience "food insecurity" on a regular basis. The growing demand is concerning, but we give thanks God has called our church to partner in this important ministry. FUMC members and worshippers are encouraged to donate holiday cookies by the dozen to the Witt House to be included in food distribution in the coming weeks!

With regard to our facilities, I remind you of a few ongoing tasks. Crews have beenworking to repair water-damaged paint and plaster in the Sanctuary the last few weeks. Designated gifts/funds are already set aside for this work. Other issues have been cared for, including door seals around the courtyard and other waterproofing repairs in the basement. The tile bathroom floor at the parsonage at 417 W . Main was replaced last year, but has since cracked and will need to be redone by the original installers.

Our church is experiencing seasonal financial pressure. October was a difficult month due to a large quarterly insurance payment and decreased giving. I tend to focus less on month-to-month giving because many households give quarterly, or even annually. The church's cash balances were stronger in 2020 and 2021 due to pandemic grants and less extracurriculars. The national economic situation has shifted in 2022 and 2023. Our giving has stayed nearly identical and we have tried to keep our spending in line. Through October, YTD general funds giving for 2023 is $\$ 704,866$ versus $\$ 713,671$ in 2022. Spending in 2023 is $\$ 797,252$ vs. $\$ 799,237$ in 2022. Our church deserves a great deal of credit for its giving despite denominational and economic challenges. I give thanks for your consistent generosity and dedicated financial support.

The concern lies in growing expenses and ongoing needs. We need to end this year strong and begin 2024 in a healthy position. Expenses are growing. For example, our insurance will go up about $20 \%$ this coming year. Planned and unplanned capital needs will grow more expensive. I understand from experience your personal financial needs may be growing, as well. No one is immune to these challenges. But I want to encourage you in your giving this month and as we begin 2024. You can give in many ways, including cash, check, bank draft/transfer, online, via stocks or IRA distributions, etc. I have full confidence in God and in our congregation concerning our financial future. We will seek to be wise, prudent, and faithful as we move forward.

Again, I wish you a happy Advent and Merry Christmas. It truly is the "most wonderful time of the year" as we gather for fellowship and worship in the coming weeks. My heart is filled with anticipation surrounding the holiday season. May the peace of God be near to you!
